Enrichment Course Requests

In middle school, students take Exploratories. All RMS students from Grade 6 to 8 will take the following exploratory classes: Foods, Technology Education (Woodwork and Metalwork), Music, and Art. The purpose of the Exploratory rotation is for adolescent students to have a chance to experience different courses over a period of time to develop skills, as well as to truly get an opportunity to find their passions.



Enrichment courses offer middle school students a choice. Every Wednesday, RMS students go to Enrichment: a two-hour block of time in which students attend a 10-week course that they wish to explore. There are four terms of Enrichment courses throughout the year. Some examples of these courses are Band (as explained below), Dance, Outdoor Education, Cooking, Robotics, Crafts, Basketball Camps, and more. We are aiming for the first day of Enrichment classes to be Wednesday, September 16. The start date is dependent on how quickly we can collect all of the course request forms.

Now is the time for students to request the Enrichment course that they would like to take for term 1 and 2. You will find an Enrichment course request sheet and description sheet attached. Please read both carefully and complete the course request sheet. Please have your child complete the course request sheet and return it to his/her Mentorship teacher during the first week of school. Please be sure that your child's course request sheet is handed in by **Friday**, **September 11.**

Please note that Enrichment course placements are not first-come, first-serve. We will do our best to place students in one of their requested Enrichment courses.

Friday, August 28 – Grade 6 and 7 students receive Enrichment Course Requests sheets at WEB Orientation Day

Tuesday, September 8 – Grade 8 students receive Enrichment Course Request sheets from their Mentorship teachers. Any Grade 6 or 7 student who did not receive sheets during WEB Orientation may get a sheet from their Mentorship teacher as well.

Friday, September 11 – All course request sheets due to the students' Mentorship teachers.

Wednesday, September 16 – First day of Enrichment courses.
