PRINCIPAL's MESSAGE

Welcome parents and guardians to another fantastic October at RMS,

I apologize for the newsletter being a little late. Its been an exciting start to the month and I have a lot to share about our school and the goings on of students at Rutland Middle. There are a couple of important events that I would like to start with, most notably our first parent/guardian/teacher conference evening on Thursday, October 18 from 5:00-7:00 pm in our gymnasium. We encourage any parent/guardian to come if you would like to meet your child's teachers or if you'd like to meet and discuss your child's current progress. We do have a couple of teachers away for various reasons on that day, and we have asked that they communicate home in advance. Please note that if you cannot attend that evening, please contact your child's teachers to set up an alternative time to meet. Teachers are happy to meet any time that mutually works for everyone's schedules. Secondly, our yearly partnership with the UBC education program is about to begin. New student teachers will make their annual visits in October to our Humanities classrooms (October 16, 23, and 30). We are fortunate because of a long-standing partnership which lasts nearly ten years that our school is the first stop for UBC's new cohort of student teachers. Some of your children may have one of these groups of new student teachers pop by for one block each week on those dates. Our students and teachers are always amazing hosts for these new, young professionals, and Rutland Middle is very proud to take part.

And the same as last year's learning focus of our school, we are working hard to engage students in our school using staff professional development around Inquiry. Some of our teachers have begun to work with other teachers in the District looking to change their practice through innovation in the classroom, and to align our practice with BC's Curriculum. The Instructional Leadership Team will be supporting our teachers using research from the OECD's Innovative Learning Environments Project and the World Innovation Summit For Education, to improve our pedagogy, to better teach your children. This work will take time and lots of hard work, and we are very excited about the possibilities for RMS and our students moving forward. If you have any questions about this, please don't hesitate to contact me in the office.

Parents and guardians, please also mark Sunday, November 4 from 10:30-3:00pm on your calendars for the annual Okanagan College Career Fair. If you or your children are curious about careers in the trades and about programs at Okanagan College (1000 KLO Road), you are invited to attend. You will have the chance to meet faculty, instructors, visit classrooms, labs, and trade shops. For parents/guardians and students who have attended in the past, it is a valuable experience.

To finish, when Hallowe'en approaches on October 31, students who wish to dress up to school are encouraged to show off their costumes and to celebrate school spirit. We do ask that costumes be appropriate for a middle school audience, that students who have prop weapons please leave them at home, and that if students are wearing masks, to remove them when in classrooms and when they come into the building.
