Artona Photography Rep -- Rep-- Caleb Maupin, Has worked with RSS, Black Mtn, Peter Greer, Davidson Road etc. Family owned photography company based out of British Columbia (Lower Mainland), Do not require a multi year contract, They sell by the sheet \$18.99/sheet.(3 sheets \$32.99) They are cheaper than any other provider and they include the download that comes within 24 hrs. They have a very quick turnaround time from picture day-- viewable within 24 hrs of pictures being taken. Rod and James will review the current contract and make a decision about weather to change from LifeTouch.
- 4. **Principal's report**--April 28 Clerical Appreciation day James and Rod typically send the admin staff out for lunch or bring lunch in for this day and they handle the calls during that lunch period. They are our frontlines and do so much for us.
  - --Constable Leslie Smith was able to share a presentation regarding Internet safety with the Grade 6 classes. Teacher feedback was great and they would like to do it earlier in the year, next year. Grade 7's and 8 presentations should happen shortly.
  - The Articulation process is currently happening- helping to build new classes to provide the best combination of kids in each class. Introduction to Rutland Middle is happening through videos and talks with the Grade 5 students coming in. They are hoping to still have a web day in August where the Grade 5s are introduced to the school.

Electing incoming parents for the PAC- we have to wait until they are actually in the school, and then they can be elected in September (they can be unofficially elected in May and then officially put in place once the child is enrolled in September)

### 7. President's Report & New Business

6.1 COBSS Bursary Recipients have been chosen. --Marie worked with them over the phone and narrowed down the winners and back ups. 2 candidates were chosen that will receive \$1000 at the end of the school year. The student must go to school by the fall otherwise the money goes to the back up student.

#### 8. Reports

- 1. Treasurer--See Report. No money is coming in and very little is coming out. Most money that was allocated from the fall funding requests have gone out other than the money that was allocated that didn't end up happening due to COVID. Field trips that were approved to have funding did not happen due to COVID-19 consequently money was not spent. We need to determine how much money needs to be left in the PAC for November funding requests given that they will not have the same fundraising options. Gaming funds come from the government but cannot be used for any curricular activities.
  - Should the PAC be dissolved (no parents step up to be on the PAC) then the money will either be drained on funding requests or donated as per PAC bylaws.

- 7.2 **Funding Requests** See the funding requests attached.

**Year End activities - Kelowna Gymnastics, Level Up** -- Kids would stay with their cohorts and most of the activities would be done outside. Kids would be required to sanitize prior to doing the activity.

**Fencing** -Kids would need to wear 2 hoodies or a winter jacket however the "sword" does bend so that the kids don't get hurt. (Ward, Parker, Green, Galiano).

Mr. Butterworth - **Outside Furniture** between the art room and gym - planter boxes, picnic tables, - however total cost was not provided. **Not approved at this time - require a better plan.** 

Mr. Wiebe - Stem activities for virtual learning activities- Grade 6

Mr. Lafontaine - Female Basketball Uniforms -50% of the cost approximately - \$1000

Mr. Cadman - Ping Pong tables for winter months - 7 tables, paddles, balls - \$2700.63

**Learning Assistance - Chrome books** to support students with learning disabilities \$400/book. 4 would be \$1600 - **school has Chromebook that will be provided.** 

Foods class - scoops for cookie batter

**Teachers Kelly Newsler and Jenna Zimmer** were looking for equipment for outdoor teaching - tent, folding wagon - Allow for a functional outdoor classroom.

**Ms. Schmidt** - **requesting IPADS** for new immigrant students (up to 18 children coming in from refugee families) these IPADS help with translation and help the children be able to communicate.

Mr. Smith - \$8000 - Machine that helps with making jewelry - to encourage girls doing metalwork. **Not Approved.** 

Band - tenor sax and alto sax - some children cannot even afford rental and this would allow them to be able to rent them out through the school. 10-15 years life expectancy.

Music - First priority Tenor Sax. Alto Sax 2<sup>nd</sup> priority.

\$22400 in General Fund - this is up to PAC discretion and can be used on anything.

\$7796.00- Gaming funds - Gaming funds can be spent on the following -- Year End Activities, basketball uniforms, furniture, sports and playground equipment, musical instruments, No technology.

Mr. Smith's request was put on hold for now due to the high cost of this request.

Mr. Butterworth's request - due to the amount of money and the CUPE issues, this has been put on hold.

Year End of Activities - As long as COVID protocols are followed, Approved.

Mr. Wiebe -Virtual Gearing Up Learning Session - Approved

Grade 8 Fencing - As long as COVID protocols are followed - Approved.

Basketball Uniforms - Approved

Ping Pong Tables- Approved

Learning Assistance Dept - Chrome books - Put on Hold as the district has given some Chromebooks that will be distributed to them.

Kitchen Equip - Approved

Outdoor Teaching Requests-As long as the teachers are willing to share with the other teachers - Approved

ELL - 4 IPADS - Approved

Art Class - Cutting Boards- Approved

Band - Tenor Saxophone- Approved
