- 7.2 **COPAC** Paula provided report on the COPAC meeting.

Update regarding COPAC Parent Conference.

COBBS presentation at COPAC meeting about their organization.

Discussed Committees' at School District Level that can help advocate for our students – Paula will get descriptions and share with our Parent Group regarding these to help our students.

Discussed that Marie presented to COPAC our concerns about our school. Trustees Moyra and Chantelle were in attendance to hear Marie Speak as well as the Superintendent.

 - 8.1 Funding Requests.

Teachers that presented:

- <u>1. S. Schmidt</u> ELL Program. Discussed the need for our school to have more ipads for our ELL students. We have more ELL students than any other school in the district and we are expecting more students soon. ELL students are vulnerable individuals and become very isolated. Having iPads will help the students communicate and translate textbooks and their language. This makes a HUGE impact on their experience at the school.
- **2. C. Luthin** Foods Teacher. Requesting new Aprons and cutting boards. Both are in need for Hygiene reasons. The Aprons are 20 years plus old and falling apart. Mrs. Luthin also requesting a stacking Washer & Dryer for space saving and because the current Dryer is on its last leg and takes 3 hours to dry items.

- <u>3. A. Gagliano</u> Kindness Crew. Mentorship class would like t-shirts for Lunch time this is to help students identify themselves as the Kindess Crew build spirit and welcoming environment.
- <u>4. C. McDowell</u> Music Department Reviewed her list of requests. Lots of requests as this department has been lacking investment for many years. Equipment is falling apart due to poor maintenance and care. Mrs. McDowell spoke about her vision for the Music Department and how she wants to grow the department including a jazz band, discussed her collaboration with RSS Music teacher and SMS.
- <u>5. Rob Aviani</u> spoke to other requests. Outdoor Equipment and PE Equipment in desperate need to be replaced, swag bag items, Field trip for Swimming & Skating, jackets for the volunteer coaches as Thank you to them.
- **<u>6. Marie Howell</u>** spoke to remaining requests based on the request forms.

Mr. Laird & Mr. Aviani excused themselves for the discussion and decision portion of this meeting.

One further request was added to the list for music – Guitar stools – the request was accidentally placed in the quotes and Marie missed it while writing up the Funding Request List. All agreed to add this to the list.

Total Funding Request came to \$33,640.92.

Jodi Schmitke Treasurer discussed that we could spend \$21,132.25 at this meeting (\$10,000 from Gaming and \$10,000 from General approximately).

Marie and Jodi emphasized that as much as we would like to pay for everything we have to prioritize and spend our money wisely. We have to plan to bring funds forward for the next school year as well as consider there are Spring Requests for yearend events.

Fundraisers in the works are Purdy's, Hot Lunch Program, and Marie is looking into West Jet Tickets for a Spring Raffle Sale to raise further funds for our school.

Parents in attendance reviewed the Request list.

Jamie Lowther spoke and offered that her family will pay for the Kindness Crew request of \$250 for the T-Shirts for this project. Jamie discussed how this program has made a major difference in her daughter Emilie's life this year. The parent group thanked Jamie and accepted this offer.

As a Parent Group we decided:

Teachers that presented at the meeting were to be a priority.

Requests that effect ALL students are a priority (field trips, dances, breakfast club, and equipment).

As Group we deferred the following items:

- 1. <u>Foosball Tables</u> Will look for alternative way to bring these to the school. Parents are concerned about the supervision of these items, and rules etc. Although the group understand it gives the students an alternative activity at lunch time especially through the winter the overall feeling was that this was not a great way to spend PAC money.
- 2. <u>Shop Class Requests</u> Mr. Smith has requested these items previously. PAC has provided a significant amount of funds to this department in the last 3 years. These are BIG ticket items. We would encourage Mr. Smith to seek alternative funding for these Grants or even a local business sponsor. Marie will discuss further with the Administrators of RMS and Mr. Smith about alternative funding.
- 3. <u>Mrs. Miles</u> request for Lap Tops was incomplete no quote provided. The PAC at present cannot afford to buy and maintain Lap Tops. The SD will be refreshing the school next year.
 - Dictionary/Thesauruses Parent group overall feeling was that we like this idea of students not relying on technology. However these resources are only as good as the year they were printed. Encourage use of the Library supply as a way to teach the students the purpose of these.
- 4. Mrs. McDowell request for 24 guitars. Deferred until Grant Funding decision. PAC in favour of helping in this area if grant declined. Will re-look at this item in the spring. PAC deferred The Clinician for the Choir & Band Retreat for now. Again PAC is willing to relook at this in spring time. Parents present all agreed these are important for the Music Program to grow.
