PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello parents and guardians,

Each year I say this, but it always amazes me that we are already heading into November. We are happy that our Grade 6s have settled into their new school, and I want to take this opportunity to thank the Grade 8 WEB leaders and their teacher leaders (Mrs. Zimmermann and Mr. Tonn) for helping with the transition. We are lucky to have such a dedicated leadership community to take care of all our students.

Winter is coming, and I would like to encourage parents and guardians to have their children dressed appropriately for the season as they come to school. As the temperature drops, having students wear the right clothing for the season (jackets, gloves, snow pants, boots, etc.) is important as many of our students are walking to school, and are playing outside during breaks. We want to limit the number of students phoning home for changes of clothes because they have been playing outside and got soaking wet; we realize it is very difficult as parents to drop what you are doing to run dry clothing to the school. I really appreciate your help in having these conversations with your children when the weather begins to turn.
