Lastly, I would like to sincerely thank our PAC for their ongoing support for volunteering in our hot lunch program, for working alongside Rob and myself in doing active Inquiry work, and for their unending support for our school and our students. This Fall, the PAC spent nearly \$19,000 on equipment and programs to enrich students' experience. I am always in awe of their dedication and love of our Voodoo community.
