- SD23 plan for re-entry with changes announced by PHO/SD23
 - Multiple meetings held with Ministry of Edu/Ministry of Health about re-entry, delayed start
 - Only 9-14 students in attendance of the first couple of days
 - Multiple staff meetings had to collaborate with Health and Safety Committee to ensure staff and students stay safe ready for Jan 10th startup - Enhanced Safety Restrictions - avoid large gathering, avoid larger meetings, transitions during classes, lunch hour, recess, etc
 - Admin appreciates that staff and students are so resilient and open to continued change; continued optimism that 2022 will promote returning back to 'normal'
 - Will continue to allow students to intermingle with each other, will not re-establish cohorts, programs like Exploratory, Enrichment and sports/band will continue
 - The importance that schools need to be safe to stay open for the social, emotional and academic development of the students

 2nd: Misty Mitchell
 - Skating let's wait and see what the final costs will be
 - Students haven't had to show vaccine passport as of yet to attend field trips or events in the event it is required to show the vaccine passport it will not be an event that will be attended to honor inclusion of *all* students;
 - Staff who are organizing events check to see requirements re: vaccine passport
 - Cost of Skating approx \$100 per session; session being 2 classes, hence reducing cost to PAC; Kaylyn looked into skating costs - likely PAC will be able to pay for the whole thing
 - Funding for Cricket machines will be further explored as COSTCO may donate or reduce costs to PAC
