PRINCIPAL's REPORT

- Thank you's to the new executives provided on behalf of the school administration
- Acknowledgement of World Teacher Appreciation Day October 5th
 - o RMS used a more inclusive term "World Educator Appreciation Day" recognizing anyone within the school that participate to enrich the students RMS experience served coffee to all admin.
 - Great start up smoothly number of students = 580 approx (actual number to follow post meeting)
- COVID this year no cohorts, 50 minute lunch break, most other COVID protocols still in place, ie/ masking, hand washing, hand sanitizing, social awareness rather than social distancing (2 meter rule)
- School Sports back up and running
- Enrichment program restarted
- CREW has returned (like homeroom first 15minutes of each day, mixed grades)
- Truth & Reconciliation Day Sept 30th
 - As a school we had a week long recognition, reflected, teachers spent time learning about the history, Orange Shirt Day, Ms. Harris (non-enrolling support teachers) - strong Indigenous focus with her work - amazing at supporting teachers/students around truth & reconciliation and their understanding of what it really means
- Enrichment restart of the program quite a lengthy process to get up and running, tried really hard to appease students choices, excited to see the students learning along the side of peers with the same interests
- Rod and James have offered guest speaker/resources from the admin to help support the RMS PAC families interests

GUEST SPEAKER - KIM DENNIS (TEACHER) - has been at RMS x 5years

- Information provided about Scholastic Book Fair Virtual or In-Person
- Worried about the lack of opportunity that many children have with respect to access to books many children don't have books at home or even have access to different options for reading material
- Concern about the lower level reading levels across the school demographic
- Scholastic Book Fair no cost to bring the book fair into the school or hold it virtually
 - Essentially runs itself we may only need a few volunteers, ?enlist CREW students to volunteer Grade 8 students to help?
 - Time sensitive due to rumors that Scholastic only comes to Kelowna Oct/November could possibly share dates of delivery with RLE
 - Kids and adult friendly
 - In person fair could it be held in the cafeteria or the back of the library
 ? Before/afterschool or at lunch hour? How do we ensure that COVID protocols are upheld?
 - o If not this year or next year?
 - James to help promote this idea working with Kim to help bring this to the school

- Does RMS have a donation program for books?

TREASURER'S REPORT

- General Account approximately a little over \$13,000
 - o Only one transaction BCPAC but will be credited back as membership is now free
- Gaming Account \$591.64 + 2021-22 gaming grant which has not yet been assigned to account (usually deposited in later October); most Gaming funds spent last year
 - Submitted and approved just waiting for deposit of funds
 - Amounts are usually \$20/student, estimating \$10,000
- In order to determine the amount of money per student we need: The number of core teachers & the number of students, once we determine this we can assign an amount per student. Kaylyn created an online form for the teachers to ask for the funds directly from the PAC rather than
 - With gaming funds there is an amendment to the criteria and gaming funds can now be used for classroom non-instructional time - ie/ leisure activity

 - Yes this can be re-established in cafeteria (previously had access to 4 microwaves); the only hiccup is how we ensure COVID protocols as we are only allowed 50 people in cafeteria at a time(PHO=50 people in one common place at a time)
 - Can the microwaves be spaced out throughout the school? Not really as the hallways don't have alcoves etc.
 - James/Rod to have a look at re-implementing sooner than later
