- 3. Shannon Ward's request for \$10,000 for Athletic Banquet and new sports uniforms. Discussion re: request for \$3000 out of the \$10,000 for Athletic Banquet. Motion put forth by Ana Longman to review the request to fund \$3000 for the Athletic banquet at the Spring Funding meeting/AGM, seconded by Jennifer Gelz in favour. VOTE: 7/7 unanimous YES. Discussion re: request for \$5000 out of the \$10,000 for the sports uniforms specifically new Volleyball uniforms. Motion put forth by Ana Longman to spend \$3000 rather than \$5000 for RMS Sports uniforms, specifically Volleyball, seconded by Jennifer Gelz in favour. VOTE: 7/7 unanimous YES (gaming account)
- 4. Discussion regarding Andrew Butterworth's, Suzie McGuigan's and Sarah Pennell's request to take students skating and swimming (to H20. Decided to pool these field trips together to provide a more cost effective, more inclusive involvement of all students. RMS PAC decided to fund the whole school going swimming once to H20 and the whole school to go skating twice at Rutland Arena. Motion put forth by Jennifer Gelz to spend up to \$6000 for request for the whole school to do one skating field trip and one H2O field trip during the 2024-25 school year, seconded by Jaime Raymer in favour. VOTE: 7/7 unanimous YES (gaming account)
- 5. Elan Mackenzie's request for \$400 for supplies for Craft Club @ lunch. Motion put forth by Jennifer Gelz, seconded by Kelsey Schneider in favour. VOTE: 7/7 unanimous YES (gaming account)
- 6. Ken Lonstrup's request for \$380 for cutting boards for Grade 8 paper mosaic project (for Exploratory). Motion put forth by Ana Longman to spend up to \$380, seconded by Jennifer Gelz. VOTE: 7/7 unanimous YES (general account)
