## **Presentations of Learning (POL's)**

The teaching and learning at Rutland Middle School provides students with opportunities to demonstrate the School District 23 Attributes of a Learner. At Rutland Middle School, each student works towards becoming a Learner, Thinker, Innovator, Collaborator, and Contributor. Our work in supporting these Attributes is consistent with the direction of BC's Redesigned Curriculum. This curriculum encourages the personalization of each child's learning with a focus on making real-life connections based on a student's passions and interests.

In Mentorship class, students have been learning about the Attributes of a Learner. All year, students have been collecting evidence from all of their classes of how they are working towards becoming Learners, Thinkers, Innovators, Collaborators, and Contributors. On June 22, 23, and 24, Rutland Middle School will host our annual Presentation of Learning days. During one of these days, students have the opportunity to demonstrate to an audience how they have met the requirements of the School District 23 Attributes of a Learner. Presentations of Learning create a purposeful way for students to talk with adults about their learning and offers parents (or community members) a direct and active role in their educational experience. Students have been working on their presentations for several weeks and have chosen a variety of ways to demonstrate these attributes.

Each Mentorship class will be split into 3 separate groups and assigned one of the presentation days and times. The presence of a family member or friend is a crucial part of the process. That person's role is to:

Listen and encourage student during POL
Ask questions or make comments regarding the POL
Celebrate your child
